
Transition Team Update

The BLC Transition Team met on July 7th, 21st, and 28th. The next meeting is scheduled for Aug. 4th. The team reviewed feedback from non-BLC community members. One insight gained: members belonging to other area faith communities are familiar with BLC and have an overall positive image, someone who is not connected to a faith community has very little knowledge of BLC.

The team is now focusing on internal aspects of this congregation. Currently, the emphasis is on BLC's history. Aug. 8th you'll be invited to participate in a hands-on project in our fellowship hall. The more participation the better! This collective history sharing is important (newer members can especially benefit) for understanding how God has fed and sustained us over the years; through joys and sorrows.

We are collecting Core Values feedback from members; currently, we have input from about 40 members. If you have not already done so, you can submit your electronic (emailed to you) or paper response. All of this work helps BLC discern how God is calling us to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ in word and deed within our specific context. Pastor's Pen Remembering our Baptismal Identity

"So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see everything has become new!" (2 Cor. 5:17) God's creating activity is not isolated to a one-time event, but is continual. And throughout

scripture we encounter God's promise to create anew. Every one of us has been born anew in baptism. Nicodemus had a hard time understanding how someone could be born again, but Jesus was not talking about entering the womb a second time. Jesus was speaking of God's activity of birthing us into new beings through the waters of baptism and the power of the Holy Spirit. (See John 3:1-12). God doesn't just give new birth to individual people, but promises that all creation will be made new. "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away....And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new..." (See Rev. 21:1-5).

Theologians often speak of God's creating activity in three ways: creatio ex nihilo (creation out of nothing), creatio continua (continual or ongoing creation), and creatio de novo (new creation). Basically, God is understood to be the Creator of all that is; but God didn't just create everything once, long-ago and then step aside and watch everything unfold passively. God continues to be active in creation. And God creates things anew (or renews them). Using trinitarian language, we can say God is the Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer of all that is. God is active in the life of each individual, God is active on the cosmic scale, and God is active in between these; including the life of a community. God has been active in the life of BLC since its beginning in 1914, God sustained and recreated BLC when the community separated from West Blue Mounds Church in 1999, and God sustained this faith community after the tornado in 1984. Through the power of God's Spirit this congregation was born anew in 1985. In some sense a congregation is always being made new.

As BLC continues to transition toward a new settled pastor, discovering your new identity is important. Some questions worth asking are: "Who and what [is BLC] becoming as a congregation, and how has our context changed over the years? What gifts (assets) define us; not simply our building or staff, but our changing participants and neighbors?

We need to watch and listen, not only for what to conserve, but for what might be emerging in the midst of this new identity." (Taken from Congregations in Transition by the Rocky Mountain Synod-ELCA).

When a congregational assembly affirms its baptismal identity in Jesus Christ it is asked: "Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?" Each member of this collective body responds: "I do, and I ask God to help and guide me." This response is followed by another question: "People of God, do you promise to support and pray for one another in your life in Christ? And the response is: "We do, and we ask God to help and guide us."

In this time of transition, we do well to remember our baptismal identities; both individual and corporate. Grounded in Jesus and the promises God has made to us through him, we pray for one another, share what inspires us in this unique expression of the church known as BLC, and continue to experience the ways God is creating us anew. All of this enables the congregation to discern God's mission and vision for this local expression of the body of Christ and the community it is called to serve.

One of my seminary professors used to recommend that anytime we encounter water (in the shower, washing our hands) we make the sign of the cross on our foreheads and remember our baptism. That's good advice! Each day we are washed anew, each day God creates us anew.

God's blessings to you as you experience God's creating activity in your life and the life of this faith community.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH Blackened Shrimp Bowls

Ingredients:

2 c. cooked brown rice

I lb shrimp - tails removed, peeled and deveined

1 1/2 tsp. cumin

I tsp. paprika

I tsp. garlic powder

1/2 tsp. onion powder

Kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper

2 Tbsp olive oil, divided

I c. fire roasted corn

I red pepper, diced

2 Tbsp. freshly chopped cilantro, plus more for garnish

Juice of 1 lime, divided

I avocado, thinly sliced

Directions:

- I. Make shrimp: in a large bowl, toss shrimp with cumin, paprika, garlic powder, onion powder, and season with salt and pepper. In a large skillet over medium-high heat, heat I Tbsp olive oil. Add shrimp and cook until opaque and charred.
- 2. Make corn salsa: in a medium bowl combine corn, red pepper and cilantro. Add 1 Tbsp. olive oil, juice of half a lime, and season with salt and pepper.
- 3. Build bowls: divide rice between four bowls. Top with shrimp, corn salad, and 1/4 avocado each. Garnish with cilantro, squeeze with lime and serve.
