Pastor's Pen

Certain numbers in the Bible signify completion or represent wholeness; these include 7, 12, and 40. In Genesis we hear how God creates in six days and rests on the seventh day. Noah takes seven pairs of every clean animal onto the ark before enduring 40 days and nights of earth covering rain (See Genesis 7:2-4). The Israelites wandered in the wilderness for forty years before entering the Promised Land. Jonah told the Ninevites they had forty days before God would overthrow the city (the city repented and God had a change of heart). Jesus faced temptation for forty days in the wilderness. Jacob had twelve sons, there were twelve tribes of Israel, and Jesus called twelve disciples. Twelve isn't a very big number, but in the Bible it's a complete number. Jesus was able to take twelve disciples from ordinary walks of life and do extraordinary ministry through them. While twelve may have been a perfect number, a symbol of completeness, the disciples were far from perfect! Before his death, Jesus' closest followers would betray, deny, and desert him; but after Christ's resurrection, they would spread the Good News of God's love through lesus to all nations.

Some weeks ago, I handed out an article titled: "Will the Congregation Come Back?" Should not be our biggest concern (6 Better Questions)" by Karl Vaters (you can read his blog entry at: https://karlvaters.com/will-the-congregation-come-back/). Pastor Vaters has some follow up blog posts which elaborate on this theme. I highly recommend reading them: "7 Reasons Some People Might Not Come Back To Church" and "7 Ways To Reach The People Who Aren't Coming Back To Church" (you can also read these online at: https://karlvaters.com/not-come-back-to-church/ and https://karlvaters.com/arent-coming-back-to-church/ respectively. I can also make paper copies available.

It's understandable for us to be worried when we see numbers declining in the church; whether we're looking at people in attendance or financial giving. But ultimately church isn't about numbers (other than the One God who comes to us in three persons)! At the heart of the concern with declining numbers, is the overall health and wellbeing of the congregation. It's reasonable to conclude: declining numbers = declining health; which eventually ends in death. The church is experiencing a paradigm shift as we live through a pandemic; it will be forever changed. Change can be scary; it means the death of former things and stepping into an unknown and uncertain future. But the church is no stranger to death AND resurrection. We followers of Christ, know that death is not the end, but a part of the process which leads to new life!

So, is there anything practical a church can do, as it lives in uncertain times and with lower numbers? Yes. (See the above articles for some good recommendations). All churches can always work on spiritual growth. Growth is not limited (nor primarily) about quantity, but includes quality. Every person of faith can always grow more rooted in their faith. Prayer, Bible study, devotional reading, and other spiritual practices always benefit the collective body of Christ. I highly recommend a book by Presbyterian pastor, N. Graham Standish, titled Becoming A Blessed Church: Forming a Church of Spiritual Purpose, Presence, and Power (I quoted from his 2nd edition last newsletter). Here's another quote:

"The focus of a blessed church is on doing what God is calling us to do, having the confidence to know that God is in our midst, and relying upon God's power to get results. This focus may not lead to numerical growth, but it does lead to health. In other words, by focusing on leading people to spiritual encounters and experiences of God, the church and its members end up forming healthier and more vibrant relationships with each other, relationships that emerge out of a deep spiritual connection with the Trinity and each other. The more the church focuses on grounding its ministry and mission in a dynamic relationship with the Trinity, the more its members and other participants engage confidently in ministry and mission that make a difference in the local community and in the world, if only in a small way. As the church grows in its relationship with God, the members become increasingly aware of God's power in their lives. In short, becoming a blessed church means becoming a place where God is present and God is experienced. Lives are thereby healed." (p. 21)

God has blessed, and will continue to bless, BLC through our ever-changing times. All who follow Jesus Christ, have been blessed by God, through Jesus, to be a blessing for others.

May God continue to bless you with more blessings than you can ever count!
