Pastor's Pen



Advent Blessings People of God!

It has been said that God is most profoundly at work in our fear, confusion and woundedness. Why can't God work in the joy, clarity and comfort of our lives? I would suppose the truth of the matter is that God does work in all circumstances for good. However, we are only able to really experience and feel God at work when we are going through a "walk in the wilderness." When we are enjoying a "walk in the park" we are distracted, we are more self-reliant and confident that we forget how dependent we are on God. I suppose it is only when I acknowledge I cannot make the journey on my own, that I accept God's walk with me.

We are on a journey this Advent season. We are journeying to Bethlehem and along the way we will encounter some very familiar characters of the Christmas story. Zechariah & Elizabeth, Mary & Joseph and the shepherds—but there is much more to their stories, their journeys, than just the Sunday School Christmas program of baby Jesus lying in a manager. We will journey with these ancient people and connect with their fear, their confusion and their woundedness. Ultimately, we will discover how our lives are not much different than those of ancient times. The many challenges we face, the unexpected twists and turns of life, and the shame and guilt that travels along with us.

But, it is there in the mess of life, that God is hard at work for good. Mary reminds us that all things are possible with God—and certainly there is no other story in our Christian tradition that demonstrates how God meets us in surprising and impossible ways, then as a baby, born to poor and humble parents.

The story of Jesus' birth is a story that has been read and handed down for generations. It is our most important story. But at its center, is a story of hope. I read something this week that said hope requires risk and sacrifice. Our instincts are to run away and hide, to self-protect and self-medicate. Hope requires believing in what is unseen. It means we may hurt. It means we may be afraid. It means taking steps on an unfamiliar journey.

In the midst of the hardship that went with Mary and Joseph's journey, amid the deferred dreams and dashed hopes, God was working to redeem the world. I imagine this was not a journey Mary or Joseph wanted to be on. Just like our lives many times lead us on paths we would rather skip. But the most important part of the journey is not the road, but who walks with us, and that is God, and that is where our hope comes from.

All of us take unwanted journeys. But God always walks with us on these journeys. God works through them and redeems them and these difficult journeys will never be the end of our story!

My hope and prayer for you this Advent and Christmas season is that you will experience the birth of Jesus with new eyes and new ears; that you will connect your personal journey with those who have gone before and renew your hope, trusting all things are possible with God!

Recipe of the Month from Ronda Bowe

Butternut Squash Soup

8-10 cups peeled and cubed butternut squash (one median-large squash

- I heaping cup chopped onion
- 4 TBSP unsalted butter
- 4 cups chicken stock/Bouillon
- I tsp. dried marjoram

1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper (add more if you like spice)

6 oz. cream cheese (8 oz. for a heavier soup)

Black pepper and salt to taste

In a large saucepan,, sauté the chopped onion and butter until onions are tender. Add cubed squash, chicken stock, marjoram and cayenne pepper. Bring to a boil then cook for 15 minutes on medium, or until squash is tender. Purée squash and cream cheese in a blender or food processor in batches until smooth. Return to saucepan and heat through on low. Finish with salt and pepper to taste.

*Do not boil (squash and cream cheese will separate).


