A total of 55 members were present at the Congregational Meeting.

Call Committee Chair Baumgarten presented information to the Congregation about Pastor Rhia Strohm. The Congregation was given the opportunity to ask question about Pastor Rhia.

A motion was made by Council Member Otis Nelson/Council Member Shelly Sandry to put the following question to the Congregation: Should BLC issue a call to Pastor Rhia Strohm?

With the motion made, the question was placed before the Congregation. The appointed tellers passed ballots and baskets to collect the ballots. Once the ballots were collected, the tellers proceeded to the Narthex to count the ballots.

Call Committee Baumgarten presented the proposed figures and provisions of compensation package for Pastor Rhia to the Congregation. The Congregation was given the opportunity to ask questions about the proposed figures and provision of compensation package.

A motion was made by Council Member Mieden/Congregation Member Terry Nelson to have BLC delegate the responsibility for the Council to finalize the compensation package for Pastor Rhia, should the congregation vote to issue a call be positive. Motion carried by voice vote of the Congregation.

The tellers completed counting the ballots and provided the results to Council President Lease.

 Should BLC issue a call to Pastor Rhia Strohm? With a positive vote of 53-2, a call should be issued to Pastor Rhia Strohm. Strohm has 30 days to consider the call after it has been received.

A motion was made by Congregation Member Russ Moyer/Congregation Member Alycia Hathaway to adjourn at 9:59 am. Motion carried.

The new year brings a clean slate, full of new hope. Room to write a new story. A reset to go forward. A new season for the people and ministry of BLC. It is a time to dream and to plan what is next.

Your elected leaders and I have been working on putting together a plan for the new year. One thing that seems apparent is that it may be time for some reorganization of and creation of new ministry teams. Where do you see Barneveld Lutheran Church five years from now? Ten years from now? Change is hard. You know that. I pray that the most difficult parts are behind us, and look forward to the many blessings God has in store for us and this, God's church, in 2023.

#### Review of 2022 Financial Statements and Account Balances

Net loss of \$47,970 compared to net income of \$5,368 in 2021.

\$5,000 gain attributed to increase in unrestricted giving.

\$7,000 loss attributed to a decrease in restricted giving.

\$38,000 decrease attributed to a \$23,000 gain on investments in 2021 vs. a \$15,000 loss in 2022.

\$7,000 decrease attributed to both Pastor Erich and Pastor Rhia being paid during May 2022.

Cash decreased by \$27,600.

Revenues totaling \$152,451, a decrease of about \$45,000 over 2021 revenue.

Expenses totaling \$200,392, an increase of about \$8,000 over 2021 expenses.
