Moyamoya Awareness Day

In honor of Moyamoya Awareness Day on May 6, I'd like to share the story of my son, Dustin, who has been on and off the BLC prayer list. This is Dustin in August of 2021 right before the first of his four brain surgeries. (Spoiler alert: gruesome picture coming later.) He's trying to be brave, but mostly he's terrified.

A year or two before he came to the hospital, he started to have some vision problems. We all know the drill — start with one doctor, get referred to another, get some tests, get referred to more doctors. Months later, he finally got admitted to the hospital. The waiting was hard.

The good news? His optic nerve is great. He'll probably never have glaucoma, which was one of the things they first suspected.

Puffs of Smoke

The bad news? He has something called, moyamoya disease, which none of us had ever heard of. "Moyamoya" literally means, "puff of smoke" in Japanese, which is where the disease was discovered in the late 1950s.

What happens is the carotid arteries in the brain start to narrow, and in some cases, completely shut down. To compensate for that, your brain is smart and sends out these extra little vessels (which look like puffs of smoke) to get more oxygen. However, this is not sustainable, and surgery is one of the only options. Without surgery, a person who has MMD has a high risk of dying from a stroke.

Dustin was lucky in that he never had any full-scale strokes, but he did have several small strokes or TIAs — transient ischemic attacks. Even after, he continues to have TIAs and small seizures.

Risks

There is no known cause for moyamoya disease, but Dustin didn't fit in any of the high-risk groups, which include Asian heritage, family history of moyamoya disease, medical conditions (such as neurofibromatosis, sickle cell disease and Down syndrome among many others), gender (females more than males), and age (children younger than 15 years old are most commonly affected).

Dustin's Prognosis

While Dustin's surgeries were initially successful, he's had to have two additional surgeries on the right side of his brain and likely will need more. Since there is still so much researchers don't know about moyamoya, we're learning as we go. It's not uncommon for people to have multiple brain surgeries over the course of their lives. With surgery, moyamoya "warriors," as they're called, are able to have a normal lifespan... but at the same time, are at increased risks for strokes.
